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HOW TO LOOK AFTER YOUR HOME AND BUILDING



1 | IN WINTER



- **Open your curtains in the morning** to let the sun in and **close the shutters at night** to keep the heat in.
- **Do not cover your radiators** and drain them once a year.
- Thermostat: maintain it between 19°C and 21°C during the day and between 16°C and 18°C at night.

2 | IN SUMMER



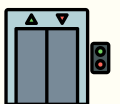
- Keep the sun out with **shutters, blinds** or **curtains**.
- **Make the most of the fresh air:** air the house out at night or very early in the morning.
- Use your appliances during the **cooler hours of the day**.

4 | VENTILATION AND CLEAN AIR

The building has changed; the house no longer ventilates naturally and damp may start to appear, so...

- Air out your room **for 10 to 15 minutes every day**, preferably in the morning and always before turning on the heating.
- Open your windows **after cooking, taking a shower or cleaning**.
- **Use an extractor**, if you have one.
- Consider **leaving the window slightly open** while you sleep.

5 | ELEVATOR



- The elevator is new. It is everyone's responsibility to look after it.
- **Do not force** the doors open or shut.
- **Do not exceed** the weight limit.

6 | FURTHER TIPS



- If there is a motion detector in the entrance hall and on the staircase, **do not use the light switch**.
- To reduce your water and electricity consumption, consider installing **faucet aerators** (they save up to 40–50% of water), **LED bulbs** (they last longer and use less energy) and **dual-flush toilet**.
- **Avoid overloading** your power sockets.
